ABOUT US

Over 21,000 students are currently enrolled at the University of Regensburg. The modern campus of the UR provides its students with excellent facilities to pursue their studies or research. The faculty of law was founded in 1967 and is one of eleven faculties at the University of Regensburg. It offers its 2,500 undergraduate and LL.M. students an extensive and first-class law program with outstanding service throughout the entire study period. The university's language center offers a large variety of German language courses throughout the semester and intensive preparatory language courses at all levels.

... as an exchange student

Every year, there is a large number of undergraduate students from other law schools (our numerous ERASMUS+ partners and others) who enroll with our faculty for one or two semesters. In fact, Regensburg has recurrently been voted into the top ten Erasmus destinations.

Exchange students can chose from our whole study program. While for the majority of our courses the language of instruction is German, there is a wealth of offerings also in English, especially on topics in European and International law. In addition, you can attend courses from other faculties, too, both in English and in German.



... as an LL.M. student

The Faculty of Law offers international students with a law degree the possibility to earn the Magistra / Magister legum degree (LL.M.). This is an (extendable) one-year master course, covering the basics of German law and requiring, i.a. the completion of an extended research paper. The teaching language of this program is German.

... as a researcher

The Regensburg Law Faculty has for long been a very popular destination for researchers at different career stages from all over the world. Some come to write their dissertation and earn their degree of a Doctor of Laws (Dr. jur.) here.



Some come to spend a postdoc in Regensburg, become part of the stimulating research environment at our various Chairs and work closely with one of our professors. Also, the faculty receives a large number of advanced scholars every year who visit Regensburg for individual research or joint projects.

To all of them, the university offers excellent research facilities in two modern law libraries with large collections of books and periodicals and extensive online research facilities.

Furthermore, researchers can find specialized libraries on the social sciences and humanities in walking distance on campus. Faculty advisors work closely with Dr. jur. students and postdocs and consider it their responsibility to facilitate their immersion into faculty life.
